Kieran Davies (Assistant Manager/ Defender) Kieran has great knowledge for his age and is currently doing his FAW B Licences, he has worked with Jonathan during his time at Coleg Sir Gar, where he worked with the Football Academy Structure as well as doing a Sports Coaching Degree. He's currently works with Carmarthen Town Academy and Cardiff City Development Centre where he develops young players within the area.

Spencer Cutlan.(Goalkeeper) Spencer signed season 2009 –2010 after previous played welsh league for Croesyceiliog. Spencer is currently a student at Trinity College University. Bright future and loves the game

Gary Evans (Defender) Another local product, Gary has been a virtual ever present since 2004. Gary is a powerful and commanding figure that plays in the centre of defence. Young player of the year in 2005. Probably the Club's most improved player over the last couple of years. Player of the year season 2007-08. A Delivery Man.

Huw Jones (Defender) A local product, Huw is comfortable in a back three as well as full back or wing back either side where he enjoys a more attacking role. Jonah became a first team regular in 2005 and made the left back position his own, Voted Newcastle Emlyn Football Club "Young Player of the Year" in 2006. Previous Clubs include Aberystwyth Town and Carmarthen Town at Youth level. Strong in the tackle

Huw Sexton (Defender) Huw is an attacking fullback which uses his athletic ability to cover ground on the left hand side. He's a balance player which has a good understanding of the game. He just finished his Degree in Sports Coaching & Performance.

Craig Richardson (Defender) Craig is another new signing from New Quay. He represented Welsh Schools under 18's and has played for Aberystwyth Academy. Craig is a solid defender which can also play from the back. He'll be a good addition at Emlyn

Alex Thomas (Defender) Alex is vice captain and a strong centre back which can bring the ball out of defence to start off attacking opportunities. He's a great asset to the club, in which he also shows good leadership skills.

Andrew Davies (Defender) Andrew has a good understanding of the game and can play in a number of positions along the back four. He shows great promise for the future.

Dai Williams (Defender) Dai is a young defender which is currently studying in Pembrokeshire College. He can play in a number of positions and has improved a lot in the last year.

Steven Hicks (Defender/Midfield) Played all his football for Emlyn, from U9's to senior level. Captained Emlyn Youth, and last year was Assistant Player Manager for the reserves. Can play in defence or midfield. A committed clubman and committee member. A Carpenter.

Steffan Davies (Midfield) Steffan has come through the system at Parc Emlyn. He's a left sided player who can also play upfront and causes problem to defences with his pace.

Chris Ferrier (Midfield) Chris is a Llanelli based player, he's studying in Coleg Sir Gar in which he won player of the year and players player of the year last year. He shows good attitude and desire for the game.

Jake Harries (Midfield) Another one of the clubs promising youngsters, Jake originally made his Welsh League debut as a sixteen year old, back in May 2007 and has progressed with a full season in the Welsh League Reserve Division. Jake is a good passer, is not afraid to get stuck in and does the simple things well.

Liam Samuel (Midfield) Liam has great feet and ball control in which he has found him having a number of trials with pro clubs when he was younger. He also a student in Coleg Sir Gar and often finds himself on the scoring sheet.

Mathew Mousley (Midfield)

Matthew is a new signing which will be his first experience at Welsh League but has all the attributes to make a very good footballer; he was also with Aberystwyth Academy a few years ago. Matthew is a balance player which has good understanding of the game and will be a good addition at Parc Emlyn.

Elliot Thomas (Midfield) Elliot was with Cardiff City academy for over 5 years, and then went on to play for Carmarthen Town but now studying in Cardiff University where he has represented Welsh Universities last season. Elliot has great ball control and passing ability, in which he will be a great signing for the Parc Emlyn.

Owen Thomas (Midfield) Signed from Carmarthen Town in August 2005, Owsie settled in very quickly at Parc Emlyn, a central midfielder that always wants the ball and his energy and enthusiasm cause a constant problem for the opposition. As a youth, Owen won 4 caps for Wales (schoolboy level) and also played for Swansea City. Owen is also the current captain of the first team.

Joshua Davies (Centre Half) Tall dark and handsome centre half. Has played for Garden Village in the Welsh Football League and captained Trinity College

Gethin Harries (Midfield /Striker) Gethin is a young player who can play in a number of positions. He was involved in last year's first team squad after making a good impression on his first season at senior level.

Kris Brown (Striker) Kris is a skilful striker who has good strength and speed. He's also a Llanelli based player and hopes to gain good experience in playing Welsh League. He scored on his debut game for the club.

NEWCASTLE EMLYN BRIEF HISTORY

Newcastle Emlyn Football Club has a long and successful tradition within the local leagues both at senior and junior levels. Over the past fourteen years the club has attempted to combine a successful playing side with the provision of the best facilities available for football in the Teifi Valley. These include the levelling and draining of the playing surface; the provision of a concrete path and rail around the pitch; installation of floodlights and the erection of a 100 seater stand. In the 43 years, since the clubs re formation, the clubs First Team have won 37 trophies and were runners-up 32 times, this is without the clubs numerous successes in the Mond Cup.

The club is progressive and has just completed its tenth season in the Welsh Football League, gaining promotion for the 2009/10 season to Division 2. The club currently has a sound infrastructure with two Senior Men's Teams, a Ladies Team, Youth Team and eight Junior Teams actively involved each weekend.
